<u>SCIENCE:</u> Term 2 will be spent looking at Physical Science and Energy! Be prepared with lots of potential and kinetic energy each day!

LANGUAGE ARTS: Term Two begins with a bit of grammar review and practice. We'll be learning about pronouns and their antecedents and how a pronoun must agree with, or match, its antecedent in number, person and gender. We'll also be reviewing singular and plural pronouns and problems that arise with vague pronouns which have unclear or ambiguous antecedents.

<u>READING</u>: On Monday you will add new reading sheets to the LA section of your keepers binder. Be sure to record ALL the books you read this term! You will notice the requirements for reading have increased and that you should be reading a book about every three weeks. If you're reading every night you'll have no problem meeting this expectation. You should make sure you have a December book before you go home today and have it with you every day! Really, every day! You'll be given a reading response on Wednesday which will be due on Friday.

<u>MATH:</u> This week we will tie together what we learned from the chocolate problem and begin to apply it to new situations involving multiplication and division. In particular situations where the divisor is larger than the dividend, where one or both of the factors is a fraction, or where the dividend or divisor are fractions. Expect to learn something new! You will have an assessment on your understanding of multiplication and division on Friday. For homework this week you will have a skill sheet due Thursday.

SOCIAL STUDIES: We'll be starting Article of the Week as part of social studies. Topics will center around issues that impact all of us, as well as the environment and the creatures of the world. You will be expected to annotate carefully, answer questions, and participate in discussions. At times you will be writing to synthesize your thoughts and show your overall understanding of the issues presented.
